Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 20th day of March 1988 to delegate to the six Counsellors of State therein named or any two or more of them full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council and to signify thereat Her Majesty's approval for anything for which Her Majesty's approval in Council is required:

And whereas the Church Commissioners have duly submitted for confirmation by Her Majesty in Council the Scheme which is set out in the Schedule to this Order:

And whereas the provisions of the Pastoral Measure 1983 relating to the preparation and submission of the said Scheme have been duly complied with:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth, The Queen Mother and His Royal Highness The Prince Charles, Prince of Wales, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, have taken the said Scheme into consideration, and do hereby, by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, on Her Majesty's behalf confirm the said Scheme.

SCHEDULE

PASTORAL SCHEME

This Scheme is made by the Church Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Commissioners") this 12th day of April 1988 in pursuance of the Pastoral Measure 1983, the Right Reverend Peter, Bishop of Norwich, having consented thereto.

Union of benefices

1. The benefice of Burlingham Saint Edmund with Lingwood and the benefice of Buckenham with Hassingham and Strumpshaw in the diocese of Norwich shall be united to create a new benefice which shall be named "The Benefice of Burlingham Saint Edmund with Lingwood, Strumpshaw with Hassingham and Buckenham" and the area of the new benefice shall comprise the parish of Saint Edmund, Burlingham, the parish of Lingwood, the parish of Buckenham with Hassingham and the parish of Strumpshaw, which parishes shall continue distinct.

Archdeaconry and deanery

2. The new benefice and its constituent parishes shall belong to the archdeaconry of Norwich and the deanery of Blofield.

Designation of first incumbent

3. If immediately before this Scheme comes into operation the Reverend Ivor Thomas Ronald Welch is licensed by the Bishop to serve within the area of either of the benefices referred to in clause 1 hereof he shall be the first incumbent of the new benefice.

Place of residence

4. The parsonage house of the benefice of Burlingham Saint Edmund with Lingwood shall be the place of residence of the incumbent of the new benefice.

Disposal of parsonage house

5. If before the date on which this Scheme comes into operation the parsonage house of the benefice of Buckenham with Hassingham and Strumpshaw has been disposed of pursuant to the powers conferred by the Parsonages Measures 1938 and 1947 and the Commissioners hold moneys arising from such disposal, then so much of the said moneys as in the opinion of the Commissioners after consultation with the Bishop is required for that purpose shall be applied towards the cost of the new parsonage house being provided for the benefice of Burlingham Saint Edmund with Lingwood and any balance not so required shall be paid into the Norwich Diocesan Pastoral Account; but if upon

the said date the said house has not been disposed of, then it shall, together with the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds usually occupied and enjoyed therewith, be transferred to the Norwich Diocesan Board of Finance Limited for disposal in accordance with the provisions of paragraph 9 of Schedule 3 to the Pastoral Measure 1983, and the net proceeds of such disposal shall be applied as aforesaid.

Patronage

6. Subject to clause 3 hereof, the right of presentation to the new benefice shall on each occasion be exercised jointly by the Church Society Trust whose registered office is at Whitefield House, 186, Kennington Park Road, London SE11 4BT; The Martyrs Memorial and Church of England Trust whose registered office is at Falcon Court, 32, Fleet Street, London EC4Y 1DB; and the Bishop of Norwich in his corporate capacity.

Coming into operation of this Scheme

7. This Scheme shall come into operation upon the first day of the month following the date of any Order of Her Majesty in Council confirming this Scheme.
